

50% Full & Less than 2 Months to go - KB Legion Race Weekend by Jim Gilbert

The 7th annual Kakabeka Falls Legion Half Marathon and 8 K is going ahead on SUNDAY AUGUST 18. For the third year we will again be offering the Full Marathon, 26.2 miles of some of the finest running area in the country. We have left the Full marathon course the same as last year which means the runner will leave the Half Marathon course at Mile 12.5 and head east on Pole Line Road until the hit Pointe Demureon Road. They then head north until the get to Oliver Road where they will continue on back towards Kakabeka, but first will run through the heart of Murillo, along McLean and Mcgillvary Aves.

We encourage any residents living in these areas, to come sit at the end of their driveways and cheer them on -- even put on some music for them if you wish -if the weather is really hot, and you are so inclined, a lawn sprinkler would be extra special to cool them off. The first runners should hit Pole Line Road heading east by about 815 am on Sunday August 18.

The Trans Canada Highway will be closed again for about 20 minutes starting at 7 am between Highway 588 and Pole Line Road under OPP supervision to ensure the safety of our runners.

Our race this year honours the 80th anniversary of the D- Day landings which was the beginning of the end of the Second World War. The Thunder Bay Police Pipe Band and a contingent of Soldiers from Old Fort William will be out sending the runners out on the course in style; bright and early at 7 am

We will be also running the TWO two day Challenges -- where these participants will run the 8K course the day before the main event, and then on Sunday run either the Half or Full Marathon depending on which Challenge they accept

There is still room to register for any one who wants to give a go. If a Full marathon or Half Marathon is not your thing, keep in mind we have the very popular 8K event which starts at the Legion, at the same time as all of the other runners. These folks head directly down the closed Trans Canada towards the Park, a quick circle in the lower level parking area, a short jaunt down the Hydro generating road and then back to the Legion. At the finish line your medal awaits you along with a hot breakfast to celebrate








CHIEF' CORNE by Sean Horan, Fire Chief/CEMC

First, a BIG HAPPY BIRTHDAY CANADA! Canada Day is often a day of celebration for many. Family and friends gather for good times sitting around a campfire, refreshments of all kinds ending with some fireworks. Did you know that in Oliver Paipoonge you require a permit to discharge fireworks? Of utmost importance is the safe discharge of fireworks. Please do not discharge fireworks is you are under the influence of alcohol or any legal drugs and consider your neighbors when planning an event with family and friends. Fireworks are dangercause severe injury if not handled and ous can safely.

I would also like to talk a little bit about the Oliver Paipoonge Regional Training Center. You may or may not know that the Oliver Paipoonge Fire and Emergency Services is in partnership with the Ontario Fire College delivering Certification Training throughout our region. Ontario Regulation 343/22 came into force on July 1, 2022, which requires fire fighters in Ontario to obtain mandatory minimum certification for specific tasks by 2026. This regulation was put in place for the safety of our fire fighters. Fun fact, Oliver Paipoonge currently has 75% of our fire fighters certified to Fire Fighter Level 1! We have a very busy training schedule for 2024, with certification courses for Fire Fighter Level 1 and 2, Hazmat Operations, Passenger Vehicle Extrication, Public Education, Pumper Operation and Fire Instructors to name just a few. We have just finished the Pumper Operations course, with two Oliver Paipoonge fire fighters achieving certification in this discipline. The pumper ops course consists of approximately 40 hours of online course work, followed by 4 days of practical hands-on training and one day of certification testing. A huge commitment for those taking the course. We have fire fighters from Lappe, Nolalu, Ignace, Sioux Lookout, Atikokan, Pass Lake, Conmee, Greenstone, The Office of the Fire Marshal, and Neebing attending courses so far this year. I'm so very proud of the fire fighters that are taking the time to become certified, and proud of the Oliver Paipoonge fire department members that are volunteering to help organize and deliver these courses. Without you guys, we would not be able to deliver these courses. Finally, I'm grateful for the family members of those taking part in these courses. Without your support none of this would happen.

If you are interested in helping out with the Oliver Paipoonge Fire and Emergency Services, whether it is as a fire fighter or helping out with non-fire fighting activities, such as the RTC or fire prevention/public education activities, applications can be found on the website http://www.oliverpaipoonge.ca/municipal-office/fireemergency-services Completed applications can be dropped off at the Municipal Office Attention: Sean Horan Fire Chief or you can email your application to fire.chief@oliverpaipoonge.on.ca. I look forward to hearing from you!

Be safe and remember- Prevention is the best way to fight fire!







June has seen a significant increase in severe weather events or potential events, with several Tornado warnings, potentially very high winds, heavy rainfall and large hail (one event had the potential for tennis ball size hail).

Severe weather is something that we deal with on a regular basis, however the frequency and potential severity seems to be increasing. There is not a lot we can do to change the weather; however, we can prepare for when severe weather may impact us.

First thing to do is monitor weather alerts. There are several different apps available for your phone that can give you weather watches or warnings when they are issued. I strongly encourage everybody to have an app to alert you if there is the potential for severe weather.

If you receive a weather notification, take it seriously. I know it can be a bit of a crying wolf situation when you are getting alerts all the time, however the day you ignore one maybe the day you get caught. A *weather watch* is issued when there is potential for severe weather to develop. No immediate action is required, but you should be aware. A *weather warning* is issued when hazardous weather event is occurring, imminent, or likely. Warnings indicate a threat to life or property, and protective action is required.

Second is to have a plan along with an emergency kit in place. Your plan should have a section covering severe weather, for all seasons. It should contain items like a safe place in the home should there be a tornado. Did you know that Oliver Paipoonge is in the Canadian Tornado Alley, which includes the Canadian Prairies and Northern Ontario, extending as far East as Lake Superior.

You never know where or when there is going to be an emergency. Being prepared is critical to safely navigate your way through an emergency or disaster.



Stay safe and be prepared!

DO YOU NEED A BUILDING PERMIT?

A building permit is your formal permission to begin construction or demolition. It means that the Municipality of OliverPaipoonge has approved plans for any new structure, addition or renovation. Approved plans must comply with the Ontario Building Code, local zoning by laws, and other applicable laws and regulations. It is unlawful to start construction or demolition of a building, as defined in the building code, before you get a permit.

- You need a building permit in the following situations:
- Construct a new building
- Renovate, repair or add to a building
- Demolish or remove all or a portion of a building
- . Change a building's use
- Install, change or remove partitions and load-bearing walls
- Make new openings for, or increase the size of, doors and windows
- Build a garage, balcony or deck
- Excavate a basement or construct a foundation
- Install or modify heating, plumbing, air conditioning systems or freplaces

This year there is a bumper crop .Even though you may Salready have a favourite rhubarb recipe, here Are two to try then add to your recipe collection. The first is Linda's Rhubarb Bread, a moist

,tasty loaf with a sweet and crunchy topping. This recipe makes two loaves which can easily be frozen. Then, there is Jenny's Chutney that is great on a charcuterie board served beside cheeses ,cold cuts and crackers or served as a chutney with beef or pork.Jenny's recipe stores well in the fridge and makes a nice gift presented in small glass jars.

Remember that nutritionally ,rhubarb is rich in vitamin C ,naturally low in sugar and high in fibre.

RHUBARB BREAD by Linda Davis

INGREDIENTS:

1 large egg 2/3 cup canola oil 1 and 1/2 tsp.vanilla 1 tsp.salt 1 and 1/2 cup diced rhubarb **TOPPING:** 1/2 cup brown sugar 1/2 cup coconut

1 and 1/2 cups brown sugar 1 cup buttermilk or sour milk 2 and 1/2 cup flour 1 tsp. baking soda 1 cup pecans or walnuts

1/4 cup butter

Combine the egg, oil, milk and vanilla. Add the brown sugar, flour, salt and baking soda. Stir. Do not overmix. Add the rhubarb and nuts, gently stirring. Pour into two greased or sprayed loaf pans and top with topping. Bake for 40 minutes or until cooked in the middle.Let sit for 15 minutes, to cool before removing from the pans.

RHUBARB CHUTNEY by Jenny Mol

2 cups finely chopped rhubarb, fresh or frozen; 2 cups finely chopped onion; 2 cups dark brown sugar; 1 cup vinegar; 1 1/2 tsp salt; 1/2 tsp each cinnamon, allspice and cloves; dash pepper.

Combine all ingredients in a sauce pan, bring to a gentle boil and cook about 1 hour or till desired consistency. Mixture stiffens a little when cooler. Stir occasionally to make sure it doesn't burn especially as it gets a little thicker.


Cool and then store in glass jars in the fridge, keeps a couple of months. Or separate into serving sizes and store in plastic bags in the freezer. Put in pretty glass jars and give as gifts.




